Dennis P. Tarnow: presently Professor and Chairman of the Department of Implant Dentistry at New York University College of Dentistry. He is also Professor of Periodontics and Prosthodontics at New York University College of Dentistry. Dr. Tarnow has a certificate in Periodontics and Prosthodontics and is a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology. He has a private practice in New York City. Dr. Tarnow has published numerous articles on perio-prosthodontics and implant dentistry and has lectured extensively both in the United States and abroad.

Course Outline

Implant dentistry is continuously evolving into a more predictable form of therapy. New and innovative techniques now allow for better esthetics and greater patient comfort. This course will present the most up-to-date information available as it relates to the following questions:

- Should osseointegrated implants be splinted to natural teeth?
- Are H.A. coated implants superior to pure titanium implants?
- How to attain ideal esthetic single tooth restorations.
- What styles of occlusion should be used with implant supported bridges?
- Should you use porcelain, acrylic, or metal occlusal surfaces?
- What type of temporization is best before and after implant placement?
- What are the periodontal considerations around implants?
- How do implants affect treatment planning for the advanced perio•prosthetic case?
- Surgical techniques and histological evaluation of the sinus lift procedure.
- Treating the serial extraction case.
- When do we extract a tooth and place an implant.
- Do we need attached gingiva for long term implant survival?
- The interdental papillae problem between implants.
- Use of chin blocks for ridge augmentation.
- Grafting of extraction sockets – Does it help?
- Immediate vs. Delayed Socket Placement.
- Absorbable vs. Non-absorbable Membranes.
- Can we treat ailing implants successfully?
- Is cementable or screw retained bridgework better?
- Is age or osteoporosis a risk factor for implants?
- Is smoking a risk factor for implants?
- Can we immediate load implants?
- Can we use transitional implants for fixed provisionals?
- Can we load implants earlier?

Directions to the Pines Manor:

- Garden State Parkway North:** Exit 127 to I-287 North. Exit New Brunswick - Route 27 South. Bear right onto Route 27 South. Pines Manor 1/2 mile on right side.
- Garden State Parkway South:** Exit 131 bearing onto Route 27 South. Follow approx. 4 miles and make left at traffic light (Foodtown). Cross over small bridge and make a right staying on Route 27 South. The Pines Manor is approx. 1 mile on the right side.
- Interstate 287 North:** Follow to Route 27 South - New Brunswick exit. Bear right onto Route 27 South. Pines Manor 1/2 mile on right side.
- Interstate 287 South:** Follow to exit Metuchen-New Durham (501). Bear right off exit onto New Durham road. Next traffic light is Talmadge Road - Make a Left (Quick Check diagonally to the left). Follow to just before traffic light. Pines Manor on Left.
- Route 1 North:** To Plainfield Avenue jug handle. Cross over Route 1. Go to second traffic light (Lincoln Highway-Route 27). Make a right onto Route 27 North. Four traffic lights. Pines Manor on Left.
- Route 1 South:** Follow to 287 North. Approx. 1 mile to Route 27 South - New Brunswick exit. Bear right onto Route 27 South. Pines Manor 1/2 mile on right side.
- New Jersey Turnpike:** (North or South) Exit 10 to I-287 North. Follow for approx. 2 miles to New Brunswick-Route 27 exit. Bear right off exit. The Pines Manor is 1/2 mile on the right side.
